on Ometepe Island

You'll get an instant natural thrill rafting on the Pacuare river. Explore higher climbs in and around the central valley volcanoes. Sloping back down to the border with Nicaragua through cloud and tropical rainforest a bounty of wildlife experiences awaits. Nicaragua's stunning landscape is lesser visited than its neighbour but no less stunning and we conclude with one of the oldest colonial cities in the Americas- Granada.



COSTA RICA, NICARAGUA an overview

Eco-diversity like no other - Costa Rica encases 500,000 different species which account for roughly 4% of the world's plant, insect and wildlife species. Witness Sloths, Monkeys, Frogs, Snakes, Turtles, Iguanas, Humming Birds and so much more. Wander through tranquil bird-packed cloud forests and rich rainforests brimming with a plethora of spectacular wildlife. As well as its head-turning abundance of wildlife, this Central American paradise is famed for its never-ending activities, making it an adventure-seeker's dream; the vast array of activities widely on offer include Zip-lining, White-Water Rafting and Trekking. The incredibly beautiful east and west shores that run down the sides of Costa Rica display gorgeous paradise beaches lined with jungle, such as the secluded sandy stretches of the laid-back Caribbean coastline and the 'sun and surf' pacific stretches containing some great marine life. Between the coast and the volcanoes stunning colonial cities pepper the interior around Lake Nicaragua and Lake Managua.

DAY 1: Welcome to Costa Rica

Welcome to Costa Rica! Upon arrival at San Jose International Airport you'll meet our representative, who welcomes you and takes you to your hotel.



San Jose, the capital and commercial centre, founded in 1738 is a modern city, complete will all conveniences. The city has beautiful art and architecture, and many excursion options. The city is complemented by a strong historical background, beautiful national parks and a national theatre. On December 1, 1948, Costa Rica became world renowned when its military was eliminated.

San Jose is an excellent point to begin many of the natural exploration tours available on Costa Rica and nearby Nicaragua.

DAY 2: Begin your RAFTING experience on PACUARE RIVER

After breakfast adventure awaits, paddling the class IV rapids of the Pacuare River. During your expedition lunch will be served by your guide.

Pacuare Rafting – Class IV

Here you enjoy the feeling of total isolation from urban life and the realness of being connected with nature. You see waterfalls cascade into the river from both sides as colorful, tropical birds fly right over your head. Amazing views of this virgin tropical rainforest area, appear before your eyes as you descend this true exploratory land. Wildlife is abundant, with sloth, toucans, parrots, coatis, morpho butterflies and colorful frogs being common sights.

The 18 mile one day run includes a total of 52 rapids. Few rivers in the world can offer you so many. The first 4 miles consist of



fun class II-III rapids which is a perfect time to test your new river skills and gain confidence in your team. Here you can find pockets of secondary growth forest that is extremely beautiful. After about 40 minutes we will enter the famous Pacuare River Gorge, which is 5 miles of some of the best white water rafting Costa Rica has to offer. You will also see the Huacas waterfall, a 150-foot dramatic drop into the river. After the gorge the rivers opens up to a 5-mile stretch on the Valle del Pacuare, where the river has a different character. It is wide open, which gives you the opportunity to rest a bit and take the opportunity to do some wildlife spotting. The forest remains just as lush, and the rapids just as fun.

We finish in Siquirres, at our own private Exploration Center where you can take a shower, change and enjoy the gardens and terrace while having a beer or two and reflecting with your new friends about the great adventure you just shared.

DAY 3: Transfer to La Fortuna

After breakfast at 09:00 you will be transferred to your next destination: La Fortuna!

La Fortuna is a town situated just a few kilometers from the Arenal volcano, one that is often named among the most active volcanoes of the world. Since 2010 however, activity has decreased significantly. From La Fortuna you have some breath-taking views of the volcano. Other attractions in the area include a 70 meters high waterfall, hanging bridges, ziplines, a butterfly farm and whitewater rafting. In the evening you can visit the hotsprings.

DAY 4: Hanging Bridges

After breakfast you are picked up for a panoramic walk through the jungle, crossing many hanging bridges.

The Arenal Hanging Bridges are a fun and educative option to learn more about the primary forest and the local environment. During a walk along the bridges and trails you'll be able to enjoy a unique and impressively close contact with nature. The trail makes a loop with a total length of 3100 meters within the mountainous area.

Along these three kilometers of trails you will be immersed in the divers fauna and flora of the rainforest and admire exotic animals, colorful birds and tropical plant species. While you're walking along the trails, the fascinating world of the tropical forest will open to you.

DAY 5: Transfer to Rio Celeste

After breakfast you are transferred to your next destination, at Rio Celeste, close to National Park Volcan Tenorio. Enjoy nature at the lodge, or take an optional tour.

Tenorio is an extraordinary tropical forest natural area. Hiking to the skyblue Celeste waterfall is a highlight, but the hanging bridges in the rainforest and trail to Lago Danta through the cloud forest are equally amazing. The best way to properly experience the area, is on foot. Hike the azure blue Rio Celeste in Tenorio National Park or explore the rainforest



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shrouded slopes of Miravalles Volcano. Anywhere you walk in the area you're likely to see birds and other wildlife.

DAY 6: Transfer to Cano Negro


After breakfast you transfer takes you to Cano Negro, a well-known wetlands nature reserve for birdwatching.

Los Chiles is Costa Rica's most northern town and only a stone's throw away from the border with Nicaragua. It is a great place to spend a few days and admire the astonishing amount of wildlife in this area.

The Cano Negro Wildlife Refuge is home to many different species of birds, lizards, monkey, bats and much more. You can join a relaxed boat ride in order to get to know this piece of paradise.

By travelling up the river Rio Frio, the archipelago in Lago de Nicaragua, Solentiname can be visited. This place is home to fishermen and farmers, as well as painters and crafters.


After breakfast a local guide take you out for a boat tour on Cano Negro, to observe wildlife and the many resident and migratory birds of the reserve. Afternoon at leisure.

The Wildlife Refuge Cano Negro is considered one of the richest places on the continent for bird watching. Apart from an abundance of birds, it is homes to many other animals such as sloths, three types of monkeys, alligators, lizards, bats, and a variety of flora typical of wetlands. Enjoy this floating safari through tropical rainforest and pastures until we arrive at the marsh. To name just a few bird species we have Anhinga or Snakebirds, Roseate Spoonbill, Wood Storks, the Olivaceous Cormorant, and the Jabiru, the largest bird in Central America and very endangered. Along the river we can see howler monkeys, spider monkeys, white-faced monkeys, also the treetoed sloth and some reptiles like caimans, Jesus Christ lizard and turtles.






DAY 8: Transfer to Nicaraguan border and boat to El Castillo

Breakfast and transfer to the border where a representative will be waiting for you on the Nicaraguan side. Then you continue to San Carlos where take a public boat to El Castillo.

The jungle town of El Castillo is a picturesque place filled with colorful riverside houses, cobbled streets and fruit trees. The town has a rich history filled with conquerors and conflict, and the 17th century hilltop Spanish fortress, built to protect Lake Nicaragua from English pirates, serves as a reminder of those days. You'll find and easy-going and welcoming atmosphere in El Castillo, with plenty of culture, history and beautiful jungle surroundings.

DAY 9: Hiking Indio Maiz

After breakfast you take a boat for a scenic journey over the San Juan River, visiting Indio Maiz Biosphere Reserve. This tropical rain forest is home to the conspicuous Green Parrot (Ara Ambigua), often feeding on the prevalent almond tree. The reserve is also home of the elusive jaguar, toucans, howler monkeys, and different varieties of colourful hummingbirds. Return to El Castillo and enjoy the afternoon at leisure.

From El Castillo you ride down San Juan river for about 45 minutes until you reach the Indio Maiz Reserve. The Indio Maiz Reserve is home to numerous animal species, among which are deer, wild boars, pumas, sloths, jaguars, manatees, howler monkeys, white-faced monkeys, spider monkeys, poison dart frogs, snakes, crocodiles, turtles, and iguanas.

You have a 2-hour hike in the rain forest, after which you jump back in the boat to witness wildlife.



After hike we take the boat and going to explore Bartola river, where you have chance for swimming in the middle of the forest.







DAY 10: Cross Lake Nicaragua – Ometepe Island

Early breakfast and departure back to San Carlos in a public boat, from here you take a private boat towards Puerto Colón, bordering the Southside of Lake Nicaragua. Upon arrival, you are transferred by land to San Jorge to embark the public ferry to Ometepe Island. Then continue to your lodge to rest after a long day of travel.

Once thought to have been the promised land by Aztec explorers, Isla de Ometepe is made up of two imposing volcanic cones rising out of western Lake Nicaragua. Ometepe has been inhabited for thousands of years due to its fertile volcanic soils, and evidence of its past can be found in archeologic sites dotted all around the island. Most travelers come here for the sandy beaches, clean waters, diverse wildlife and stunning scenery, with numerous forests, waterfalls and springs in the island's center. Ometepe is beautiful, unique and one of Nicaragua's lesser-known highlights.

DAY 11: Ometepe Nature Experience

Your local guide meets you at your hotel for a tour across Ometepe Island, exploring this remarkable destination's abundant nature and wildlife.

Discover the natural beauty of Ometepe as you explore the island with a local guide. Your experience starts at the Peña Inculta nature reserve where you see lava rocks overgrown by primary forest, home to white-faced monkeys, howler monkeys, squirrels, iguanas, bats and many birds. After hiking through the reserve for approximately 45 minutes, you'll visit Hacienda Finca Magdalena, a community-run farm founded in 1888, where you get insight into the process of organic coffee cultivation. A short hike brings you to a site with remnants of pre-Columbian times, before your tour finishes at Ojo de Agua, a pristine natural spring surrounded by dense forest.

DAY 12: Transfer to Granada – Lava Night Experience

After breakfast you continue to your next destination, the colonial town of Granada, where you have the afternoon at leisure to stroll around and relax. Late afternoon you head to the first national park of Nicaragua, Masaya Volcano, for a spectacular nocturnal visit, observing a glowing lava lake.

Granada, or the "Gran Sultana", is one of Latin America's most beautiful cities, and is listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Founded in 1524 on the shores of vast Lake Nicaragua, this ancient town is full of history and Spanish colonial charm, and is famed as one of the oldest European settlements in the western hemisphere. Amongst the narrow streets and glorious architecture, you'll find some excellent hotels, fine restaurants and plenty of interesting sites and museums to fill your days.



The city also makes a great base for exploring the surrounding area, with volcanos, beaches, national parks and the incredible water world of Las Isletas de Granada all within easy reach.

Masaya Volcano National Park is one of the most famous volcanoes in the pacific region of Nicaragua due to its constant activity, and was known to the Spanish at the "Mouth of Hell". It offers the unique experience of seeing an active volcano up close, and watching as molten lava glows in crater just meters away from you. It's an awe-inspiring experience allowing visitors to experience a phenomenon once sacred to the pre-Columbian Nicaraguans, who were inspired by the raw power and beauty of nature.

DAY 13: Mombacho Volcano Nature Reserve

After breakfast, you visit the dormant Mombacho Volcano, which is covered by tropical dry forest, coffee plantations, and cloud forest. Arriving at the crater, your local guide takes you on a short hike where you discover local wildlife and enjoy, on a clear day, the many spectacular vistas.

Afternoon at leisure.

Journey into the lush cloud forest around the majestic Mombacho Volcano, spotting wildlife and taking in the incredible panoramic views from the top. After travelling to the Mombacho Nature Reserve, you'll begin to climb the volcano by 4x4 truck, stopping for a delicious local coffee at one of the plantations along the way. Once near the top you'll enjoy a short, guided hike along the trail, passing through a variety of landscapes - keep an eye out for the howler monkeys and white-faced monkeys, sloths, dart frogs, and the



endemic Mombacho salamander along the way. Once at the peak, you can enjoy views over Granada, the Las Isletas archipelago and Masaya Volcano.








DAY 14: End of Tour

WHEN TO GO

- Costa Rica's weather is affected by it proximity to the equator and the varying altitudes, meaning temperatures can vary depending on where about you are in Costa Rica.
- The wet season is roughly between May to the middle of November, with the heaviest rains in September and October. Costa Rica can still be quite pleasant in the wet season with rainy afternoons but sunny mornings.
- The dry season, therefore, is between the middle of November to April, bringing you sunshine and warm temperatures
- Temperatures can be anything from 16°c to 32°c. However, higher altitudes can exceed 0°c during the night.
